We are hoping for a strong adult cast and ensemble and we also need
a teen ensemble ages 13 and older to sing and dance and
scream as the adoring fans of Conrad Birdie.

*Bye bye Birdie is a comedy set in the late 1950s. The show parodies the era of
Elvis Presley and Ed Sullivan, while poking fun at the relationships between teens
and their parents, and the love stories of Albert and Rosie and Kim and Hugo
and Conrad Birdie and his adoring fans!*

Rehearsals will begin on Tuesday, February 24th.

*Rehearsals will be on Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 7-9:30 and on
Sundays from 2-5. Additional rehearsals may be needed on
some Fridays closer to the performance date.*

We have a 7 week rehearsal schedule so attendance at rehearsals will be very
important. Please consider your availability prior to auditioning.
Rehearsal conflicts will have an impact on casting decisions.

Please prepare 32 bars from an up tempo Broadway show-tune. Please no Ballads.
Songs from the show are accepted and encouraged. An accompanist will be available,
or you may use a backing track. Please choose a song that showcases your vocal
strengths and suits your preferred character.

There will be a short dance audition following your vocal audition. This show needs a
group of strong dancers for the teen chorus and good movers for the lead characters
and the male dance ensemble. The role of Rosie requires strong dance ability.
Please wear or bring shoes and clothes you can move in.
